If you haven't read our Zero Waste Facebook page you may not know how much our children, parents and teachers do on the Island with regard keeping our Island clean. Well, I think the certificate for last year's contribution deserves another applause!

Getting rid of waste doesn't just happen, as we all know. Life has become more complicated these days with so much plastic packaging and competitive markets. However, the Zero Wasters on the Island have a story that will put a smile on your face.



Our magnificent **Magnetic Island Primary School** are champions in sorting out their rubbish and as a result are reducing their waste for landfill. It has taken "a whole village approach" to make it that way. Parents are now embracing the **litter less lunchbox** which has made a huge reduction in landfill.

Collections for: Containers for Change; Terracycle for big writing instruments and Mobile Busters for mobiles and chargers are open to the community to deposit. Children sort their own rubbish into bins as they eat, and they even have a compost bin for their scraps!

Initiatives like a **kitchen garden** and a **tropical fruit orchard** have assisted the school in skills in gardening, food production and learning how to prepare and serve to the community. The children also enter competitions for recycling and participate in beach clean ups across the Island throughout the year.



This led the Zero Waste volunteers to show their appreciation of all their efforts. When the recycle recovery centre heard about the schools' efforts they jumped on board too. They wanted to join us and give some fun rewards for the kids.

Julie Woodlock the volunteer coordinator of Zero Waste Magnetic Island (that would be me) presented the certificate, and Amelia Chaplin, the Resource Recovery Projects and Education Officer presented games for the students to play for every classroom. Amelia and I felt so privileged to be attending the children's assembly with many of the parents and teachers there as well.

As I said earlier, getting rid of waste doesn't just happen but when systems are put in place we can work together to come to new solutions.

If you want to share your knowledge or tell us what your issues around waste are, then go along to the Horseshoe Bay Markets. Jan McCudden is our new Zero Waste organiser and representative for the **Horseshoe Bay Markets**. Jan runs an information stall fortnightly at the Horseshoe Bay Markets creating a lot of discussion from visitors and locals as the catchphrase "Magnetic Island - Too good to waste" resonates with the idyllic backdrop of the bay.

Examples are shown for alternatives to plastic and ways to recycle, with an emphasis on the RETHINK cycle of Refuse, Reduce, Recover, Recycle, Re-use, Repair and Re-gift. Information is welcomed by visitors regarding the Water Refill Stations on the Island and the safe drinking water in public areas, along with the opportunity for longer term stays to compost their food waste via the Bio-regen Project.

Listening to climate talk

Climate is a key topic for discussion whether it be: our motivation to do anything; how much our bills are rising; when to get solar; how do we afford it; sea is too warm; storm water is more polluted; rubbish on the beach etc. etc.
